WHAT HAPPENS AT A HEARING

Te Reo Māori and Sign Language Interpretation

Any party intending to give evidence in Māori or NZ sign language should advise the hearings advisor at least ten working days before the hearing so a qualified interpreter can be arranged.

Hearing Appearances

If you would like to appear at the hearing please return the appearance form to the hearings advisor by the date requested. If you have any time constraints, please note these on the appearance form so the hearings advisor is aware and this can be taken into account on the day.

Cross Examination

Cross-examination is permitted and parties should be aware that they may be cross-examined. The purpose of cross-examination is to ask questions of the witnesses of the other parties to:

- elicit favourable evidence from those who are able to confirm evidence or expand on helpful matters
- discredit the evidence reliability, perception, memory (or lack thereof), contradictory facts
- discredit the witness conduct, bias, prejudice, interest, motive, inconsistency

The Hearing Procedure

The usual procedure for a District Licensing Committee Hearing is:

- the **chairperson** will introduce the panel and will briefly outline the hearing procedure. The Chairperson may then call upon the parties present to introduce themselves. The Chairperson is addressed as Madam Chair or Mr Chairman.
- the **applicant** will be called upon to present their case either personally or through a representative. The applicant may be represented by legal counsel or consultants and may call witnesses in support of the application. All witnesses will be required to take either an oath on the Bible or an affirmation. After the applicant has presented their case, the committee may have questions for them and their witnesses. All parties are then invited to cross-examine the applicant and/or their witnesses
- the Reporting agencies (Police, Medical Officer of Health and Licensing Inspector) are then called upon to speak. They can make submissions and are then sworn in (by oath or affirmation) if they are going to present any evidence. The agencies must answer questions from the committee. The applicant and objectors are then invited to cross-examine the agencies
- The **local board** may present comments if they made an objection on the application
- the **Objectors** who wish to speak will be called next. Objectors may speak themselves or be represented by legal counsel or consultants and may call witnesses on their behalf. Each speaker will be required to take either an oath on the Bible or an affirmation. Objectors must keep to the reasons they objected and cannot introduce new grounds for objecting but can present evidence to support their reasons for objecting. The committee members or chairperson may question the objector or their witnesses. The applicant and the reporting agencies are invited to cross-examine each objector
- the **applicant** or their representative has the right to summarise the application and reply to matters raised by objections. Members of the District Licensing Committee may ask further questions of the applicant at this stage.
- the chairperson will outline the next steps in the process and adjourn or close the hearing.

Executive summary

- This is a report on a new on-licence application. The criteria found in section 105 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) apply to the application.
- The application has resulted from the establishment of a new business at the premises. The applicant is currently trading at a Beach Road premises but that site is due to be redeveloped.

External agencies

- 3. Police reported on the application on 7 December 2022 and do not oppose the application.
- 4. The Medical Officer of Health reported on the application on 20 January 2023 and does not oppose the application.

5. The application has been publicly notified as follows:

- One public objection has been made within the required timeframe. One
 objection was received in October 2022 which is about two months prior to
 this application being lodged and not within the public objection period.
- 7. The objector appears to have greater interest in the application than the public generally because she represents the Browns Bay Business Association. The objection relates to the criteria at section 105 of the Act. The objection lists concerns regarding:
 - · Amenity and good order
 - The impact on vulnerable communities
 - Building design and layout
 - Noise
 - Hours of trading

- Systems, staff and training
- Suitability

Suitability of the applicant

- 8. The applicant is a private company, which can hold a licence under section 28(1)(ba) of the Act.
- 9. The applicant's experience with licensed premises is detailed on the application form. This is sufficient for this type of premises in this area.
- 10. I had a general discussion with the applicant's director. The applicant is aware of its responsibility under the Act.
- 11. The applicant doesn't seek any endorsements for the licence.
- 12. I have no concerns with the applicant's suitability.
- 13. The applicant has no history before the Authority.

Manner of trading

- 14. The applicant's Beach Road premises has been inspected multiple times over the last several years. No issues were identified during those inspections.
- 15. I visited the new premises on 27 January 2023 at approximately 12.01pm. The premises was still being refurbished. A further site visit will be conducted should the licence be issued.
- 16. I have no concerns with the applicant's manner of trading.

Design and layout of the premises

- 17. A building and planning certificate is attached. The proposed use of the premises meets the requirements of the Resource Management Act 1991 and the building code.
- 18. The Auckland Council Planner has confirmed (attached) that the premises has eight dedicated car parking spaces and complies with the Resource Management Act 1991. The applicant legally does not need to provide any further parking spaces.
- 19. The Planner also confirmed that under the Auckland Unitary Plan there is no requirement for any dedicated parking spaces.
- 20. Most of the premises will be easily visible from the point of sale.

- 21. The licensed area is more precisely identified on the highlighted plan date stamped as received by Auckland Council on 6 December 2022.
- 22. The proposed designation is listed within the recommended conditions at the end of this report. This designation is suitable for the style of licence and is consistent with the requirements of section 119 of the Act.
- 23. I have no concerns with the design and layout of the premises.

Amenity and good order of the locality

Introduction

24. The premises is located in the commercial and residential area of Browns Bay. The premises is not within an alcohol ban area. The nearest residential buildings are approximately 38m away.

Density and Deprivation

- 25. There are approximately twenty on-licensed premises within 500m of the premises.
- 26. This application won't result in a change in on-licence density for the area because the business is relocating to this new site. A map showing the old and new sites is attached.
- 27. The "NZDep2018 Index of Deprivation" (deprivation index) score for the area is 4.1 A score of 1 means the area is in the least deprived 10 per cent of areas in New Zealand. A score of 10 means the area is in the most deprived 10 per cent of areas in New Zealand.
- 28. The deprivation index combines 2018 census data relating to income, home ownership, employment, qualifications, family structure, housing, access to transport and communications to give a measure of the socioeconomic deprivation of the area.
- 29. In my view, there is no reason to suggest that the area's current levels of alcohol-related harm, deprivation and density are at a level that a new off-licence at this site would likely make the area worse.

Sensitive sites

30. There are five early childcare centres, five parks and reserves, three schools and two places of worship within 500m of the premises. Maps showing these locations in relation to the new site are attached.

- 31. I conducted three monitors of the premises on Friday 10 February 2023, Thursday 16 February 2023 and Friday 24 February 2023 between 2.00pm and 6.00pm. I parked on Anzac Road across from the new site and monitored how many children walked past the premises unattended and how many children walked to and from the extracurricular activity sites near the premises.
- 32. The ages that I included in the count were from daycare age to late teens.
- 33. I observed the following totals over the three monitors:
 - 40 children walking alone or in groups of two to three along Anzac Road
 - Five children walking with parents along Anzac Road
 - Eight children with parents walked down the driveway alongside the premises towards 50 Anzac Road
 - Majority of children attending extracurricular activities in the area were transported by vehicle to and from the activities

Noise, nuisance and vandalism

- 34. During visits to the locality generally, I haven't observed any issues of noise, nuisance or vandalism. There is nothing to suggest that licensing these premises will cause noise, nuisance or vandalism in the area.
- 35. I have attached a two-year Noise Report for the applicant's current premises at 775 Beach Road, Browns Bay as an indication of potential noise at the new premises.
- 36. The report shows one complaint lodged on 8 January 2022 which was deemed not excessive.

Visual amenity

37. The premises is still being refurbished.

Comment

- 38. In terms of section 105(1)(h) of the Act, there is no reason to believe that the amenity and good order of the locality would be likely to be reduced, to more than a minor extent, by the effects of the issue of the licence.
- 39. In terms of section 105(1)(i) of the Act, there is no reason to believe that the amenity and good order of the locality is already so bad that the application should be refused.

Days and hours

- 40. The licensed days and hours sought are listed at the conditions section of this report. This seems appropriate given the nature of the proposed licensed premises and the nature of the locality.
- 41. I discussed the applicants' intended hours of trade (9.00am to 3.00am) when this application was first lodged. The applicant agreed to reduce the closing hours to 1.00am in accordance with other premises in Browns Bay and with their current licence hours.
- 42. The licence hours advertised in the public notices were done so because of this agreement.

Systems, staff and training

- 43. The application form includes a host responsibility policy which outlines the steps the applicant will take to manage the premises. The applicant has appointed three certificated managers.
- 44. The applicant appears to have appropriate systems, staff, and training to comply with the law and has had multiple compliant site visits at the current premises.

Other goods and services

45. I have no concerns with other goods and services at the premises.

The object of the Act

- 46. The object of the Act is to ensure the safe sale, supply and consumption of alcohol, and to minimise alcohol-related harm.
- 47. There is nothing to suggest that granting this application would be contrary to the object of the Act.

Conclusion and conditions

- 48. I do not oppose the application.
- 49. The applicant has agreed in writing (attached) that the following conditions best suit the way they intend to operate the premises:
 - (a) No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.
 - (b) Alcohol may be sold only while the premises are being operated as a tavern, and only during the following days and hours:

Monday to Sunday 8.00am to 1.00am the following day

- (c) Drinking water must be available to customers from the bar upon request and from a self-service water station on the bar.
- (d) The host responsibility policy that was submitted with the application must be complied with.
- (e) No intoxicated persons may be allowed to enter or to remain on the premises.
- (f) Appropriate signage regarding the restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons must be prominently displayed adjacent to every point of sale.
- (g) The gaming room is designated as a restricted area and the remainder of the premises is designated as supervised.





Background and History

The Brownzy Sports Bar (Brownzy Holdings Ltd) began trading in July 2008 on the same premises that The Brownzy has occupied for over 100 years now, (previously a Cobb and Co Licensed Restaurant and Bar).

It has a history of providing an iconic live music venue similar to the Gluepot and Kings Arms (both now ceased trading) in Auckland City.

The current site is to undergo a transformation to retail and accommodation and so the decision was made to relocate the current business to a new location in Anzac Rd (just around the corner).

The site chosen was a commercial unit that had previously housed a butchery but was vacant for some time and rather neglected with abandoned vehicles and a shipping container occupying the front of the building amongst weeds and cracked windows, (see photos attached under separate cover).

The proposed new site has no massing or overall scale changes to the existing building but does involve external alterations (addition of glazing, activation towards the street, outdoor seating/balconies) that will result in appearance that adds a safe and visual contribution to the streetscape and the locality.

The sites use is compatible with the adjacent land use where a range of non-residential activities exist and sufficient separation is provided from the nearest residentially used sites.

Effects

In terms of positive effects, the new site will improve social and economic well-being of the community, and the proposed alterations to the street façade will provide street activation and attractiveness to the surrounding area.

Signage proposed is of a scale and size that will not detract from the appearance or profile of the building. Traffic safety is ensured by good visibility and the activity is easily accommodated by the roading network including public transport.

A Noise Management Plan is a condition of consent and will be completed by Marshall Day Acoustics together with restricted hours for delivery contractors and refuse collection.

The development will contribute to a strong network of centres by locating a food and beverage activity within walking distance of the Browns Bay town centre.

Provision of Alcohol

As it's a Tavern the Sale of Alcohol will be a primary purpose.

A range of non-alcoholic and low alcohol beverages will also be available should they prefer such options.

Provision Of Substantial Food

Signage advising the range of food available will be displayed. We will always have available for customers at least 3 different substantial types of food

The food available will be set out in the Menu attached to our application and will be promoted throughout the premises and staff will actively encourage the consumption of food to slow the onset of intoxication.

Staff Training

All staff will be trained with regards to the requirements of the Act and the policies outlined in the Host Responsibility Policy to ensure compliance with the current liquor license regulations. Employees will be frequently trained on how to recognise signs of intoxication and how to check customer identification where necessary.



On-Licence Application: Brownzy Sports Bar, 1/48 Anzac Road, Browns Bay

I write on behalf of the Browns Bay Business Association Inc. in my capacity as BID Manager. This 'objection' is primarily to communicate our concerns about the potential impacts to existing businesses and organisations in the immediate vicinity that the applicant, Brownzy Holdings Limited's t/a Brownzy Sports Bar may cause as a result of its relocation from 775 Beach Road, Browns Bay to 1/48 Anzac Road. The Business Association wishes to ensure that the relocation of the existing bar and gambling facility do not adversely affect the area, and that the best interests of all existing businesses, organisations and community groups are taken into account when considering the application for a new on-licence.

Under section 105 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, our concerns are set out below:

1. Amenity & Good Order Around Sensitive Sites

The proposed location of the new on-licence is just metres away from a block of residential flats, two churches, a primary school and a large number of businesses and organisations that provide services and activities for children. For many years, the immediate area has been considered a safe place for children as a hub for education organisations and community groups. Twenty existing businesses/organisations with a greater interest have expressed their concerns about how the presence of a tavern will alter the safe nature of the area. Parents of customers have already informed businesses that they will no longer be permitting their children to attend the area unaccompanied after school (or at all) for extracurricular activities such as Taekwondo, dancing classes, after-school care and private after-school tuition.

2. Vulnerable Communities / Suitability

Many customers/users of the existing facilities in the immediate vicinity are young people and minors, many of which speak English as a second language. Youth, language barriers and deprivation can make people even more vulnerable to alcohol- and gambling-related harm. The application does not seem to deal with this issue, and how the applicant intends to meet a higher threshold to protect a vulnerable community.

3. Design & Layout / Amenity & Good Order

The plan shows five on-site car parks, which will result in patrons' vehicles being parked elsewhere. We have concerns that patrons will park illegally in much needed spaces belonging to nearby businesses and organisations. Additionally, patrons searching for parking will add to existing congestion in neighbouring streets, especially on an already very busy Anzac Road. Increased traffic movements may endanger pedestrians, many of whom are young children.



4. Building Design & Layout

We cannot see any information about Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) in the application. The plans seem to be incomplete and they are difficult to read because of the small print. This is of concern, particularly since the Brownzy Sports Bar was robbed at gunpoint in 2017, and given the rise in crime that the area is experiencing.

We have concerns that noise from the bar, and from the patrons arriving and leaving the bar, will negatively affect local residents, businesses, organisations and community members.

6. Hours of Trading

The proposed hours (Monday to Sunday, 9am to 3am) are inconsistent with other onlicence establishments in Browns Bay. This may result in drinking hours being extended as patrons could potentially come out of other bars at earlier closing times, and move on to the Brownzy. We are confused over the actual hours applied for as the published notice had different hours (8am to 1am).

7. Systems, Staff & Training

There does not seem to be any information in the application about staffing levels, security personnel, and rostering. We would like assurance that the applicant will ensure that it operates the proposed premises safely, and in compliance with the law. There is also no mention of staff training or training records. This is very important, especially as the director does not appear to be involved in the day-to-day running of the business.

8. Suitability

We would like to understand what the applicant's target market is, and how they will minimise risks of negative impacts on the local community. There is no reassurance that the applicant will not be hosting live music concerts, happy hours, and tits and tickets raffles at the premises, which are practices in their existing premises. The locality they are moving to is significantly different and not conducive to such practices.

The applicant needs to demonstrate an understanding of their new locality. They do not appear to have shown an awareness of who their neighbours are, or potential problems and how they will address these problems, or any of the above stated issues. The Business Association extended an invitation to the applicant in October 2022 to meet with neighbouring businesses and community groups to alleviate their concerns and discuss potential problems, but there has not been a meeting to date.



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Auckland Council Map



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
