PC 96: Open Space and Other Rezoning Matters (2024) to the Auckland Unitary Plan - Additional opportunity to lodge a further submission

A late submission relating to plan change 96 has been accepted resulting in a separate further submissions process in respect of that submission.

The submission and the summary of the decisions requested in this submission is now available on the council website <u>www.aucklandcouncil.govt.nz/unitaryplan</u>.

As provided by clause 8(1) of Schedule 1 of the Resource Management Act 1991, the following persons may make a further submission:

The following persons may make a further submission, in the prescribed form:

- any person representing a relevant aspect of the public interest; and
- any person that has an interest in the proposal greater than the interest that the general public has;
- the local authority itself (Auckland Council)

A further submission may only express support or opposition to a matter raised in an original submission (made under clauses 6 or 6A). It must not raise new points of submission. It must follow the format set out in the RMA (Form 6). Forms are on our website.

Further submissions must be lodged using the prescribed form (Form 6), which can be completed online or downloaded from the Auckland Council website at www.aucklandcouncil.govt.nz/planchanges. If you don't have access to a computer, please visit your local library or service centre and they will help you print a Form 6 from our website. Any hardcopy forms must be posted to: Auckland Council, Planning Technicians, Private Bag 92300, Auckland 1142, with a copy also required to be sent to the original submitter not later than 5 working days after lodging the 'further submission' with the Auckland Council (Clause 8A, Schedule 1).

Further submissions must be lodged by no later than **12 July 2024**.

Following the close of further submissions, a report will be prepared on the proposal and a hearing date will be set and notified to all submitters and 'further submitters' who wish to be heard.
